SUMMARY OF RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Jan 2016 – Sep 2016 *'Health Policy in Nepal: An Assessment of Clinical Guidelines in Relation to the Burden of Disease'*

For my MPH dissertation module, I designed and implemented a research project in collaboration with UK-based NGO PHASE Worldwide and partner organisation PHASE Nepal (based in Bhaktapur, Nepal). This mixed-methods study examined clinical guidelines in Nepal in relation to the burden of disease to establish any gaps in current clinical guideline provision that might ultimately be addressed through future policy. In addition to the final dissertation gaining a high Distinction mark at university, I have since written up the results of this study for publication – this paper is currently under review at the Journal of Nepal Medical Association.

April 2015 *'Community perceptions of mental illness and of mental health services in Dhading District, Nepal'*

Part of my Master's degree comprised a field research class, during which I conducted qualitative research in a remote district of Nepal. Using convenience sampling, I recruited several individuals from local villages for in-depth interviews. With the help of a translator and research aide, I explored community perceptions of mental health and mental health services. On return to the UK, I transcribed audio recordings, organised and analysed the data, before writing up the results in a final paper.
